



Glenburnie Wind Farm proposal

Project update

In November 2023, RES submitted a Section 36 application for consent to the Scottish Ministers for the 19 wind turbine and energy storage proposal, Longcroft Wind Farm, located approximately 9km north of Lauder in the Scottish Borders.

RES has now submitted Additional Information to the Scottish Ministers, which includes a reduction in the size of the proposal from 19 wind turbines to 12 wind turbines.

To better reflect the location of the updated proposal, we have also changed the name of the project to **Glenburnie Wind Farm**.

Any new representations on the application may be submitted by email to the Scottish Government via representations@gov.scot; or by post to the Scottish Government, Energy Consents Unit, 4th Floor, 5 Atlantic Quay, 150 Broomielaw, Glasgow, G2 8LU, identifying the proposal and specifying the grounds for representation.

Written or emailed representations should be dated, clearly stating the name (in block capitals) and full postal address of those making representations. Emailed representations should also include the full return email address of those making representations. Only representations sent by email to representations@gov.scot will receive acknowledgement.

All new representations should be received not later than 31st July 2025, although Ministers may consider representations received after this date.



Updated proposal

The Additional Information and revised proposal for Glenburnie Wind Farm addresses comments raised by Historic Environment Scotland (HES) and reduces potential impact on the integrity of the setting of scheduled monuments within the site.

The revised proposal includes a reduction in the number of wind turbines from 19 to 12 and a reduction in the size of the site by 459 hectares. The location of the 12 wind turbines and proposed tip height of 220 m remains the same as the original proposal.
